A Character Education Curriculum for Pupils in Nursery 3 through Primary 2



Character is something that children learn and develop through their experiences. It is both caught and taught. Character education is a deliberate effort to promote character strengths. It includes both explicit educational activities such as teaching a character education curriculum and implicit practices within a school such as role modeling good character and creating a school culture that emphasizes good character.

Character education curricula provide guidance on direct instruction in important character strengths, stories about character, and inspiring role models of people who demonstrate good character. Teaching methods can include discussions, creative arts, drama, games, cooperative learning, reflective thinking, experiential learning, debates, and character themes of the week or month. Effective character education also invites family and community participation to reinforce learning in the home environment.

The goal of character education is to raise children to become morally responsible, self-disciplined, and caring individuals who can overcome the challenges of life and contribute positively to their families and society.

Challenges

Different religious backgrounds and parental beliefs prevent schools from teaching character education.

Parents do not reinforce positive character education in the home.

Children have difficulty learning character and they are not interested in character education.

Character education is not in the curriculum.

Tarbiyya

99% of surveyed parents – both Christian and Muslim – believe character education should be taught.

- Children who participate in Tarbiyya have significantly better perseverance, hope, and joy than children who do not, based on parental report.
- Taribyya helps children adapt with challenges they face in life.
- Teachers and parents also report that Tarbiyya improves children's socio-emotional skills and reading skills.



△ Tarbiyya Character Curriculum

Tarbiyya is a character education curriculum for pupils from Nursery 3 to Primary 2. It currently includes modules for the character strengths of Perseverance, Hope, and Joy. Each module has 4 lessons. The first three lessons help children learn more about the character strength through songs, stories, games, and handcrafts. Each of these lessons is supplemented by a magazine. The fourth lesson is a celebration of learning, modeled after traditional celebrations such as cultural festival and naming ceremony.

Families are invited to participate in Tarbiyya through the Home Connection on the back page of each magazine. Home Connection includes discussion questions to prompt families to discuss more about the role of character in their family and culture, as well as fun activities for families to engage in together.
